





LHC AND STOP SIGNS

Stop signs are the continual flash point between bike riders and drivers and probably always will be, even if all states pass the "Idaho Stop" rule. The truth is, cyclists are never going to come to a complete stop at all signs.

However, we ask:

- **NEVER** blow through any stop sign at full speed.
- If there is a pedestrian, golf cart or car near, **SLOW DOWN**

SIGNIFICANTLY. Look both ways and make eye contact

with the person. You will probably be waved through the

stop sign any way.

 If you don't have the right-of-way, come to a full, footdown stop. Rolling forward at .03mph confuses drivers.
 They don't know whether you plan to go through or not.
 When riding in a group, always call out "SLOWING" or

"STOPPING".

CA Bikeway Electric Bike (ebike) Information

Electric Bikes are Identified in CA by label w/ <u>Type</u>, <u>Max Assisted Speed</u>, <u>Motor Wattage</u>

- Type 1 Pedal assist, max speed 20 mph
- Type 2 Throttle (handle bar) control, max speed 20 mph
- Type 3* Pedal assist, max speed 28 mph * 16 years or older, helmet, Prohibited from Class 1 multi-use bike paths unless authorized by local ordinance.

CA Bike Lane Classifications

- Bike Lane: Established along streets adjacent to motor vehicles with single solid white line.
- Buffered Bike Lane: Uses chevrons or diagonal markings to separate vehicle traffic from on-street parking.
- Bike Route: Uses bike route signage and/or shared road markings to designate a preferred route for cyclists.
- Bicycle Boulevard: Prioritizes bicycle travel on streets shared with vehicle traffic.
- Separated Bikeways: For cyclists exclusively and are physically separated from motor traffic, with flex posts, inflexible barriers, grade separation, and/or parked cars.
- Shared Roadway Bicycle Markings (Sharrows): Alert traffic that bicycles can occupy the lane for safe lane position. Did you know, "sharrows" is a combination of two words, shared and arrows.
